Featuring over 200 artworks by artists from across Australia, the Firstdraft Auction is one of the largestart fundraising events in Australia, and an annual survey of some of the most exciting art and artists from across the country.

Every year, artists from across Australia and around the world – many of whom received early-career support through Firstdraft – contribute artworks to be sold at the Firstdraft Auction. It is a diverse and intergenerational platform for artists to connect with a passionate community of collectors, while supporting new generations of practitioners.

Artists receive commission on the sale of their works, and all profit supports Firstdraft's free exhibitions and provides fees for the hundreds of artists, curators and writers who participate in their program each year. It is a time to come together each year and celebrate artists supporting artists.

How it works:

- 1. All bids are placed through an online auction platform.
- 2. If you're viewing the auction in-person, you can scan the nearby QR code to be directed to the online auction platform.
- 2. The highest bidder at AEST 9pm on Friday 4 August wins the artwork.
- 3. You can bid on multiple artworks, buy merchandise or fixed price items, or purchase raffle tickets to the Mystery Safe a lucky draw of 11 secret artworks that will be revealed on Friday
- 4 August.
- 4. If you are the successful bidder, win an artwork, or purchase any items, we'll be in contact once the auction ends with a number of pickup or delivery options to receive your new artwork/s.

How to get started:

- 1. Using your smartphone, scan the QR code of any artwork you may be interested in bidding on. You'll be prompted to register.
- 2. Enter your name and mobile number to begin registration.
- 3. You'll receive an SMS to complete the registration process.
- 4. Click the link in the text message to answer a few simple questions.
- 5. Once you've completed registration then you can start bidding!
